













Burroughs - Sunrise, Mt. Rainier National Park | Easy

Unbelievable views of the most iconic mountain in the United States.

Chain Lake Loops | Medium/Hard

6.5 mile trail in the Mount Baker National Forest. This is a friendly trail with stunning backdrops, but be ready for the high elevation. The loop itself has some gain - Nothing that a glass of wine can't help with. Choose clockwise or counter and aim to take a picnic lunch by one of the many lakes along the way where you can take a cool dip. Save your wine for the picnic or as a celebratory glass when you make it back to the parking lot and main visitors area.

Middle Fork Snoqualmie River | Easy

Great out and back trail in the heart of the Snoqualmie Valley. Easy hiking in a flat forested valley next to an enchanted river.

Lake Washington Boulevard between Mount Baker Beach and Seward Park

This area has always been a favorite place for a family stroll or leisurely bike ride. The level path meanders along the banks of Lake Washington with plenty of grassy areas to take a break or settle in for a picnic. Ducks, fish, geese, otters, and turtles are often seen along the water's edge. In prior years, the city had been closing down the adjacent road to cars on Sundays. This year the 3 mile stretch of road is now closed to car traffic 24/7 through at least September 8th, making it the perfect urban path any day of the week.

Snow Lake Trail | Medium/Hard

Bring a lunch and hike 1,000 ft. to get views of the Snoqualmie Valley and our enchanted lakes. This may not be where you crack open a glass of wine, but when you get home after a long day on the trail, it is exactly what you need to nurse your sore muscles.

Whidbey island State Park | Easy

South Whidbey State Park calls to tree-lovers everywhere. This day-use park on the west side of Whidbey Island is a scenic drive away from Anacortes or a short ferry ride from Mukilteo. The park offers views of the Olympic Mountains and rare old-growth stands. Walk among the giants: Douglas-fir, Sitka spruce, western hemlock and western red-cedar trees, including a 500-year-old cedar.
